"Ruined for life"...

It's the unofficial motto the Jesuits give their volunteer program, says Chris Eaton, a retired pastor whose churches are very involved in missions and mission trips. "Yes, that is what service does to you. Once you see as Jesus sees, well, in many ways you are 'ruined for life'." Chris was having a conversation with a fellow retired pastor about what "WOKE" means. Did simply seeing the word make YOU mad? Put YOU in defense? Yeah, people on "both sides" have taken this term and vilified it, alorified it, and twisted and turned it to fit their purposes. I appreciate the biblical approach Chris takes to explaining it.

He points to the story of the woman at the well, in the gospel of John, and to how Jesus tried to get his disciples to see her in a way they could not because of the blinders of assumptions and prejudices.

"So, for me 'wokeness' is about seeing what I previously did not or could not see. Jesus saw a woman at the well who was more than a second-class person. He saw her as a person with need. His disciples had not yet reached that point and couldn't see our common humanity."

Was Jesus the first "woke" being? Is Christianity a religion of "wokeness"? Things to ponder and pray about. God bless you.
